# Don't just LEAF it alone!

Conservation works at every level of complexity. Get involved with the cells you want. (UK)

### Single Cellular (solo activities)

- Pick up a bag of native wildflower seeds, then set to sowing on verges and bare patches!
- Your regular walk to school, work or for exercise? Improved immeasurably by picking up old crisp packets!
- Make some habitats! An insect haven can be a simple pile of stones or logs; biodiversity starts from the bottom.

## Multi Cellular (local organisations)

- Google your postcode and 'local wildife trust', then browse their myriad volunteering opportunities.
- If you're urban, EarthWatch could be the move. 'Tiny Forest' is an initiative of theirs, fitting forests into cities!
- Organise your own litter pick! Contact the council for equipment and bag collection; google 'Keep Britain tidy'.

# <u>Complex</u> (government)

Government is there to listen to you. From your local council to your MP, they <u>will</u> listen to you (eventually).
Find something you believe in, from backing a wildlife

- reserve, to the fight against Climate Change.
- Then, email, call, drop in on public meetings and clinics. Be polite, factual and dogged. Power to the People!

### Eusocial (citizen science)

Free mobile apps allow anyone to get involved in collecting verifiable field records. Check the UK Centre for Ecology and Hydrology's website for a list.
Our local wildlife trusts and national organisations, such as the RSPB have ongoing surveys. Search and check if they're a good fit for you!
